## **U.S. DOT Motor Carrier Safety Compliance Course - \$625**

Instruction is provided in the application of Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSR) to motor carrier industry operations. The course emphasizes the practical side of regulatory compliance from the level of regulations to the acute and critical safety violations identified by the U.S. DOT Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration. Course targets personnel within the motor carrier industry who have responsibility for administrative oversight of DOT regulatory compliance.

## **U.S. DOT Motor Carrier CMV Periodic Inspection & Maintenance Course - \$430**

Covers all aspects of commercial motor vehicle inspection and maintenance requirements found in the FMCSR's, 49 CFR Parts 390, 393, and 396, including a motor carriers' responsibility to ensure that individuals performing the periodic inspection under 396.17 are "qualified". This is a performance-based course presented in a lecture environment combined with a hands-on practical group exercise using actual commercial motor vehicles.
