Course Overview

Participants will receive the necessary information to develop a System Security Program Plan and implement the program. They will be shown how to use resources to reduce crime and improve customer and employee security. This course provides participants with a uniform format for developing and implementing security policies and procedures through a System Security Program Plan with crime prevention as the major component. Included are basic security terms, the eight steps in threat and vulnerability identification, and resolution process. The course addresses security in all stages of the system life cycle, agency policies and procedures, managing special security issues, and various types of transit security staffing.
